

Cleaning Instructions for Ice Bins

- Remove ice and throw away.
- Use vinegar (one cup vinegar in one gallon of water) or food-grade cleaner to remove lime scale.



- Or use 1/2 cup baking soda in one gallon of water. Baking soda is a gritty cleanser that can remove stain and odor.



- Sanitize the inside surfaces with chlorine bleach (approximately 3/4 to 1teaspoon per gallon of lukewarm water).



- Clean the inside drip plate and outside surfaces.



Ice Machines



Keep ice free of contamination

- Wash hands frequently.
- Use a clean scoop or utensil with a handle.
- Store the scoop in a cleanable container or on a clean surface.
- Do not store the scoop in the ice.
- Do not store food or drink directly in the ice.
- Keep the doors or lids of bins and machines closed.
- Clean floor sinks and hub drains frequently to **prevent backflow**
- Ice machine must be indirectly drained into a floor sink or hub drain.
- Clean the storage bins one or two times per month.
- Most ice machines require servicing twice a year.
- Follow instructions listed on ice machine or in owner's manual.
